#### **UPCOMING EVENTS AT SAINT PATRICK CHURCH**

October 31; All Hallows' Eve is a Catholic holiday that takes place on October 31st and is the evening before All Saints' Day. It's also known as Halloween, which is a contraction of the name.

November 1: Mass 12:00 Spanish/ 7:00 pm English

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints.

#### November 2: Mass for all souls day 12:00 noon

All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. The day is primarily celebrated in the Catholic Church, but it is also celebrated in the Eastern Orthodox Church . The Roman Catholic celebration is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful who at death have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and by the sacrifice of the Holy Mass. In other words, when they died, they had not yet attained full sanctification and moral perfection, a requirement for entrance into Heaven. This sanctification is carried out posthumously in Purgatory.

### Homily for October 27, 2024

In Mark's Gospel, Bartimaeus hopes for an encounter with divine mercy and grace. The Gospel presents a poignant encounter between Jesus and Bartimaeus, the blind beggar. As Jesus is leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus, sitting by the roadside, cries out for mercy. Despite the crowd's attempts to silence him, Bartimaeus persists, showing a remarkable faith and determination to cast all abandonment onto the Lord's mercy. When Jesus asks him, "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus responds in faith, "Master, I want to see."

This exchange is deeply significant. Bartimaeus's request for sight is not just about physical healing but symbolizes a deeper desire for spiritual enlightenment and clarity. Bartimaeus represents the soul's longing for the light of Christ, which dispels the darkness of ignorance, doubt, and sin.

Jesus' question to Bartimaeus is an invitation for each of us to articulate our deepest needs and desires. It challenges us to be specific in our requests and to trust in Christ's willingness and ability to provide for us. Just as Bartimaeus's faith and persistence led to his healing, our own faith and openness to Christ can bring about profound transformation in our lives, and not just our lives, but the lives of those we encounter.

As followers of Christ, we are called to mirror His compassion and mercy in our daily interactions. Because we are invited to enter into the darkness of the lives of others, we must ask ourselves how can we gather those who are lost, console those who are brokenhearted, and guide those who are seeking direction. Just as Jesus engaged with Bartimaeus personally, we must also engage with those we encounter with empathy, understanding, and a willingness to meet their needs. We may not be able to solve others' problems, but as in the case of the elderly couple in the airport, we can be a light of hope in their darkness, to see that God did not forget about them.

You are called to stand up for life! To respect and defend the mystery of life always and everywhere, including the lives of unborn babies, giving real help and encouragement to mothers in difficult situations. You are called to work and pray against abortion. Pope John paul II
